# Royal Victorian Aero Club, 37th Dawn Patrol

Royal Victorian Aero Club is proud to host the 37th Dawn Patrol this Sunday 18th September 2016.

The event is held each year, closest date to the anniversary of the Battle Britain, 76 years ago. It commemorates all aviators that have been lost in all theatres of war.

The morning commences with a dawn flight out of Moorabbin Airport of about 30 aircraft, tracking over the shrine, Point Cook, Port Phillip Heads, then back to Moorabbin. Followed by a Big Traditional Club breakfast, Special Guest Speakers pilot Keith Meggs who flew many types of aircraft in the Korean War and Guy Bourke who currently flies many types of warbirds.

This year we are fortunate to have a large number of warbirds on display including the Corsair, Mustang, Kittyhawk, T6, Winjeel, Focke Wulf 190 and Trojan, along with a number of other historic aircraft. The warbird final line-up will be subject to serviceability and weather conditions.

The pilot briefing will occur at 4.45am with the flight departure at dawn. Breakfast will follow at 8am located at the Flightdeck Bar and Grill which is part of RVAC, at Moorabbin Airport.

While at Moorabbin Airport, take the opportunity to visit the unique Australian National Aviation Museum which showcases a great line up of well-preserved historic aircraft.
